

2023 YEAR IN REVIEW

Mahalo a nui for supporting the American Civil Liberties Union (ACLU of Hawai'i) in 2023! We faced many challenges, but with your support, we also saw some major victories towards a more equitable and just Hawai'i!

DECRIMINALIZING POVERTY

We cannot criminalize our way out of houselessness. That's why we're suing Honolulu and Maui counties for their harmful "sweeps" of houseless communities and their belongings via Mahelona v. C&C of HNL and Davis v. Michael P. Victorino, et al..

We continue to advocate for the elimination of cash bail, decriminalizing low-level and quality of life offenses, and measures that help ensure everyone's needs are met regardless of wealth.



SMART JUSTICE

We are still committed to the national ACLU's Smart Justice campaign with two deeply intersectional goals: to reduce the number and rate of incarcerated people in Hawai'i by 50%, and to eliminate racial disparities.

We successfully stopped the funding of a "Cop City," advocated for cannabis clemency and legalization as a partner in the Hawai'i Alliance for Cannabis Reform, partnered in Going Home Hawai'i's Reentry Summit, and advocated for a true peoples' state budget that invests in #PeopleNotPrisons.

Now and always, we advocate for safer communities, fewer people behind bars, categorical clemency, meaningful reentry support, and fewer taxpayer dollars wasted on unnecessary incarceration.

REIMAGINING POLICING

The guiding principles of this work acknowledge that policing does not address the root causes of crime and calls for reinvestment in genuine public safety: housing, healthcare, education, food, job security, and more.

We continue to move forward towards trial in <u>Taylor vs. C&C of HNL, HI DOE, et al.</u> and <u>Hall v. C&C of HNL, et al.</u> as part of our campaign to defend the constitutional rights of people harmed by police misconduct.

We also helped to pass two measures, SB151 and SB372, that required police departments to be transparent, accountable, and responsible to the communities that they claim to serve.







ABORTION ACCESS & LGBTQIA+ RIGHTS

Since 1965, our affiliate has continued to champion bodily autonomy, equitable access to healthcare, and marriage equality for everyone.

Our landmark Title IX lawsuit, <u>A.B., et al., vs. HI</u>
<u>DOE and OIA</u> reached a settlement agreement
ensuring girls at the school have the same athletic
opportunities, access, treatment, and benefits in
high school sports as boys.

We celebrated the passing of abortion access rights bill <u>SB1</u> into law and are working in coalition with other partners on the <u>Change 23 Campaign</u> to constitutionally defend marriage equality! To learn more, visit: <u>www.change23.org</u>
