## MOTION FOR PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

Plaintiffs Lenora Santos, Junell Faith Aliviado, Jamiquia Glass, and Margaret Amina, by and through their attorneys, hereby move this Honorable Court for an order granting Plaintiffs preliminary injunctive relief against all Defendants in their official capacities.<sup>1</sup> In this Motion, Plaintiffs seek preliminary injunctive relief to compel Defendants to cease interfering with Plaintiffs' fundamental right to marry, as guaranteed by the Fourteenth Amendment to the United States Constitution. Defendants' ongoing and persistent violations of Plaintiffs' constitutional rights have caused, and continue to cause, irreparable injury to Plaintiffs.

As an immediate remedy and to maintain the status quo while more permanent solutions can be considered, the Plaintiffs ask that the Court order Defendants to cease interfering with Plaintiffs' right to marry their fiancés.

Plaintiffs ask that the preliminary injunction issue immediately and remain in force until Defendants remedy their constitutional violations.

This Motion is brought pursuant to Rules 7 and 65 of the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure and Local Rule 7.2 for the District Court for the District of Hawaii. This Motion is supported by the attached Memorandum, the declarations


